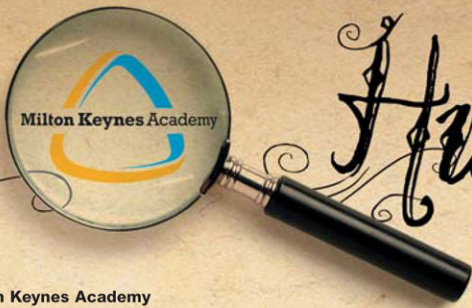


Heritage Hunters

The Year 7 students (age 11-12) were taught about the history of Milton Keynes. The students then put together a project of their own. The three projects considered to be the best are on display here.

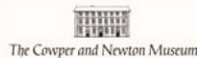


Brooklands Farm School and Two Villages Archive Trust
