

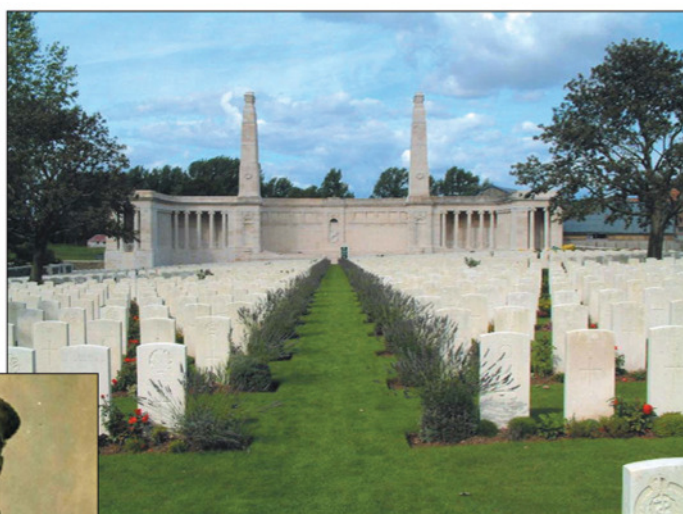

I used to walk past a war memorial in Bletchley every day. It shocks me because I had never known that these people had died in World War I. There are more war memorials around Bletchley as well as Bradwell, Newport Pagnell, Woughton on the Green and more.

In Bletchley many brave men had died during the Great War. There was one brave soldier called Sydney Spencer Morris. Sydney was born in Wolverton in 1898 and enlisted in Bletchley. He was killed in action on the 27th September 1918. After Sydney's death he was commemorated on 'Vis en Artois memorial', Pas de Calais, France.
