The Regeneration Bird Sculpture by Tim Ward

This new artwork for Wolverton was unveiled at the Square on an Arts & Heritage day on Sunday 4th May 2003 - to music from the Wolverton Town Band and illuminations from local company Holophane. The sculpture consists of a Phoenix – the fabled bird that rose from the ashes – topping one of the Victorian cast iron station columns salvaged from Wolverton's demolished station.
