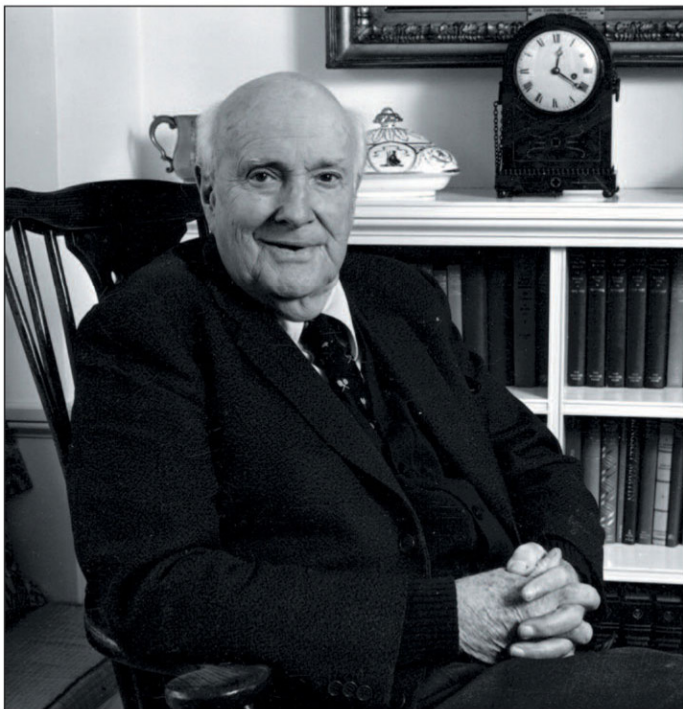

John 'Jock' Middleton Campbell, raised 'with a silver sugar spoon in my mouth', was sent to British Guyana to see how his family's fortune was made. What he saw shocked him to the core. Educated in Eton and Oxford, loving fast cars and 'fancy-free ways', he witnessed the poverty on which his life of plenty was based. His subsequent leadership of the sugar industry saw pricing restructured and workers' quality of life transformed.

The Right Honourable the Lord Campbell of Eskan 1912–1994:

- Pioneered the Open University, securing its home in Milton Keynes.
- The first Chairman of Milton Keynes Development Corporation, 1967–87, enabling the City to be created
- The UK's first urban park for 50 years named after him.
- The first Freeman of the City of Milton Keynes.
