The Wolverton Aqueduct

Known as the 'iron trunk' – and locally as the 'ackeyduck' – this cast iron aqueduct was built for the Grand Junction Canal Company in 1809 -1811. It carried the canal from London to Blisworth over the river Great Ouse. It replaced an earlier aqueduct constructed of brick piers and a wooden trough of 1803, which collapsed in 1808! The current brick abutments of were rebuilt in 1919.

Number 5: What we've achieved
