Eaglestone is in the centre of Milton Keynes, south of the City Centre. Its name is taken from a local field with the streets also named after local fields, birds of prey and local developers.

It has been described as 'a jumble of houses' due to the varying styles of houses built in the area. It was first developed in 1972. The houses were built in traffic-free areas with walkways leading to courtyards of garages which led onto the perimeter road. Later other housing was added to this and sheltered accommodation for the elderly.

There are many parks around Eaglestone where there are a lot of fun activities. They include parks such as The Griffin, Second Park, Third Park, Monkey Bar, and a new park that has just been built a short distance from The Griffin. The local school is called Falconhurst where construction work is taking place. Eaglestone consists of local shops, parks, fish and chip shops, activity centres, hospitals and much more.
